PROCLAMATION

Executive Order

TO ALL TO WHOM THESE PRESENTS MAY COME, GREETINGS:

WHEREAS, between June 10 and June 29, 1816, the first Indiana Constitutional Convention met at the territorial capital, Corydon, and created the Constitution of 1816; and

WHEREAS, the first Indiana General Assembly convened in Corydon, which became the first state capital, on Monday, November 4, 1816, to satisfy the final requirements of the United States government for admission to the Union; and

WHEREAS, Thursday, December 11, 2014 will mark the 198th anniversary of the day President James Madison signed the act admitting Indiana as the 19th state of the Union; and

WHEREAS, the history of our state and its people is valuable to our citizens, and we recognize and celebrate the growth and greatness of our state and the limitless potential inherent in its future; and

WHEREAS, on this occasion of Indiana's 198th birthday, we Hoosiers must recommit ourselves to achieving a vision for our state and its people as we prepare for 2016, when we mark the state's 200th birthday; and

WHEREAS, at noon on Thursday, December 11, 2014, there will be a Statehouse celebration focusing on the 1816 and 1851 Constitutions and other documents and symbols of the State of Indiana;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Michael R. Pence, Governor of the State of Indiana, do hereby proclaim December 11, 2014 as

INDIANA STATEHOOD DAY

in the State of Indiana, and invite all citizens to duly note this occasion.
